Dignity is the key moral concept when caring for people who are vulnerable. People living with dementia have experienced many key losses in their lives. This makes them vulnerable.

Dignity is an important component to the quality of life. The Royal Commission into Aged Care Quality and Safety commenced in Adelaide on 18 January 2019 and will deliver its final report by 30 April 2020.

The Commissioners will conduct hearings and/or round table discussions in each capital city and some regional centres.
